Only performance-based categories, e.g., Skits

How?

Look for the character or series on a retail website. BUY IT! WEAR IT! Optional: Alter it







Skills required

Ability to put together an outfit for a theme.

E.g., Pajama, Christmas, Festival

Can I compete in this?

Depends on the percent of items crafted

How?

Pick a character, imagine them in a particular setting, coordinate an outfit that character would wear to that event or location.

Skills required

Sewing, leather crafting or armor making



Can I compete in this?

Absolutely!

How?

Gather references (or make your own), list all the pieces you have to make or buy, take it step by step.

Can I compete in this? You owe it to yourself


How? Try not to cry, cry a lot

- O Do you like the character <u>design</u>?
- O Do you <u>relate</u> to the series?
- O Do you want to join your <u>friends</u> in a group?
- O Does it fit your skill level?
- Is it a <u>challenge</u> for you?

Cosplay and Competitions

- Categories of Difficulty
 - Beginner
 - Intermediate
 - Master
- o Craftsmanship
 - Majority of the cosplay needs to be handmade
- o Pre-judging
 - Be able to tell a panel of judges about your process, usually with a portfolio
- Stage Presence
 - Become your character
- o Awards!
